Dear Members of Congress,

The City of Glendora greatly appreciates your support for the HEROES Act. Among its many provisions, the bill Honors our heroes, by providing nearly \$1 trillion to state, local, territorial and tribal governments who desperately need funds to pay vital workers like first responders, health workers, and teachers who keep us safe and are in danger of losing their jobs.

In particular the provisions that would provide \$375 billion in Federal aid to help cities and counties provide vital services responding to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Within 30 days of enactment, \$125 billion in much-needed Local Coronavirus Relief Funds would be apportioned to cities via a modified Community Development Block Grant formula. Funds could be used for COVID-related expenses incurred by cities, to replace lost revenues and to respond to the negative economic impacts of COVID. To assist with longer-term economic recovery, the Act would also provide an additional \$62.5 billion within one year of enactment. Funds would be available until expended, which will provide important fiscal flexibility to our cities and Los Angeles County over the next several years. The HEROES Act would also remedy a significant deficiency in the previously enacted CARES Act by authorizing the \$150 billion Coronavirus Relief Fund for States and localities to be used to cover lost, delayed, or decreased revenues due to the pandemic.

Outlined on the chart below are the estimated amounts to be directed to SGVCOG members. Without this Federal aid to cover significant current COVID-related costs and anticipated revenue shortfalls, our cities may be forced to cut services, including emergency response services, at a time of growing need. While the HEROES Act must yet pass the Senate, we truly appreciate your strong advocacy for cities as together we respond to the challenges of this unprecedented crisis.
